Mick Fleetwood, legendary drummer and founding member of Fleetwood Mac, was born June 24, 1947 in Cornwall, England. He began his professional drumming career at the age of 16 and has remained at the forefront of the music industry for over 40 years. In 1977, Fleetwood Mac released the band's multi-Grammy Award winner Rumours, which remains one of the biggest selling albums in music history and has recently become the #1 Rock Album on iTunes. In 1998 Fleetwood Mac was inducted into the Rock n' Roll Hall of Fame. Mick has co-written two books, including the NY Times Bestseller, My Life and Adventures in Fleetwood Mac. Fleetwood continues to find critical acclaim with his music, including a Grammy nomination in 2010 for his Mick Fleetwood Blues Band. As a businessman, Mick operates his own wine enterprise, Mick Fleetwood Private Cellar, which has found great success in retail markets such as Costco and restaurant chains such as Fleming's Steak House. A lover of art photography, Mick has had fun turning his passion/hobby into a viable business, having his own photographs featured in *American Photographer* magazine and local galleries on Maui. Mick is embarking on his next venture, Fleetwood's on Front Street, a restaurant and pub on Maui. Opening a business of this sort has been a life-long dream of Mick's since he opened up "Club Keller" (his pretend/fantasy venue) at the age of 12 in his family's barn in Gloucestershire, England. A family man, Mick has four daughters and two grandchildren. He and his family have their permanent residence on the Island of Maui, Hawaii and also maintain a home in Los Angeles, California.
